Our competitive, highly-accredited academics are as impressive as our diverse range of student activities and outreach services. Our scenic suburban campus is only 20 minutes north of Manhattan, where even more avenues of possibility await.







Details on transferring credit to Iona College

- *Initial Credit Review* - Prospective students can meet with a transfer admissions counselor to receive a preliminary assessment of how many credits can be transferred to Iona. Final decisions on transfer credit are made by the dean's office only after a student has been admitted.
- *Evaluation* - Academic advisors determine how transfer credits will be applied to your degree program at Iona.
- Courses with grades of C or better may be transferred, provided the course is comparable to an Iona course.
- A maximum of 64 credits may be accepted from an accredited two-year college. A maximum of 90 credits may be accepted upon transfer from an accredited four-year institution.
- The last 30 credits, as well as at least 15 credits in your major field of study, must be completed at Iona.

- Freshman seminars, nursing, medical, internships/co-ops, independent studies, certificate programs, paralegal, remedial courses, and office technology (e.g., secretarial procedures) courses are not transferable to Iona.
- A course description and/or syllabus from the previous college attended may be required from the student for an official credit evaluation.
- The final credit evaluation cannot be produced until all final official transcripts are received by the Admissions Office.

How to apply

Basics:

- Transfer admission is performed on a rolling basis, with no formal deadlines. However, we strongly suggest that you submit your application by July 1 for the fall semester and by November 1 for the spring semester. You may submit a paper application or apply at www.iona.edu/applyonline.
- All transfer applicants are required to submit a final, official high school transcript. Students with fewer than 24 credits will have their high school grades and test scores evaluated as part of the admissions process. The high school records of students who have earned more than 24 credits will be weighed less heavily.

Requirements:

- A final, official high school transcript or equivalent GED.
- Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.
- SAT or ACT scores are mandatory for students under 24 credits.
- TOEFL exams are required for international students. (required score: 213 computer/550 paper/80 internet)
- Letters of recommendation and an essay may be required on a case by case basis.

Scholarships and Financial Aid:

- Students will be considered for academic scholarships based on prior academic performance.
- Additional scholarships are available for Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) and Alpha Beta Gamma (ABG) members.
- All students must complete the FAFSA online within 30 days of their admission. Once the FAFSA is on file, Iona's Office of Student Financial Services will determine your eligibility for need-based financial aid, such as student loans, PLUS loans, TAP, PELL and federal work study.







Highlights

Many of our programs are accredited by the highest specialized accrediting councils, including AACSB International for the Hagan School of Business and NCATE for the Department of Education.

Mass Communications (ACEJMC) is one of four accredited programs in the state of New York, and Social Work (CSWE), Education and Computer Science (ABET) boast the top accreditations available.

The School of Arts and Science features nearly 40 majors, including 5-year bachelor's/master's programs in computer science, criminal justice, English, history, psychology or chemistry/computational computer science.

The Hagan School of Business features 7 areas of concentration and national recognition that complement its international accreditation, as well as having a fast track to the MBA program.

Many of Iona's teams often appear in NCAA tournaments including basketball's March Madness. Iona Athletics is the only Division I college program in Westchester county. Our teams (the Gaels) compete in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC).

There are over 90 student clubs and organizations available to you: learn to play anything from rugby to bagpipes. Engage in student government, campus ministries, or college media like TV, video, and advertising.
