- f. show up at as many events as possible in residence halls;
- g. abide by the Residential Life policies, demonstrate leadership and skills by working in a partnership with Res. Life.

In Montgomery House, ministers are required to:

- a. rotate cooking responsibilities;
- b. share at least 3 meals a week together;
- c. attend weekly house meetings & prayers;
- d. keep common areas of the house clean;
- e. support mission of the house as a place of hospitality open to faculty and students;
- f. make Montgomery House home during the school year and avoid frequent weekends and nights away.
- g. sponsor 5 programs each semester along with the Rice Hall minister(s);
- h. abide by the Residential Life policies, demonstrate leadership and skills in working in partnership with Res. Life.
